   1.46 more public, less private;
- Much more international access than direct access;

   AA4 to move forward










## 8 initial projects

- Cross-cutting Ventures Fund East Africa, Acumen, \$ 25 m;
- Energy Efficiency Green Bonds, LAC, IADB, \$22 m
- Water Security, Maldives, UNDP, \$ 23.6 m;
- Urban Water Supply and Waste Management, Fiji, ADB, 31
