3. Gather input on key challenges and solution related to key sectors: Water, energy, and food;
4. Develop potential of Cambodia climate technology adoption in which is inline with CTCN project and eligible criteria;
5. Continue cooperation with CTCN and DPs to promote Science, Technology, and Innovation to accelerate climate tech and actions in Cambodia.

Submission Format The Request Form may be submitted in one of the following formats: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Word file with a digital signature, or • A scanned PDF file bearing the handwritten signature of the NDE, accompanied by the editable Word version of the same form. 4. Multi-Country Submissions For requests jointly submitted by multiple countries, each involved country's NDE must sign an identical version of the Request Submission Form. These signed forms must be submitted together. 5. Collaboration with GCF NDAs If the technical assistance request is intended to support the Green Climate Fund (GCF) Readiness Programme, the NDE is encouraged to collaborate with the respective country's National Designated Authority (NDA) for the GCF during the preparation and submission of the request.
