Climate Technology Network (CTN) & its role in CTCN

- The CTN forms a **core pillar** enabling CTCN to deliver its mandates and follow Advisory Board guidance.
- The CTCN follows a **demand-driven approach**, responding to the needs of developing country Parties through their National Designated Entities (NDEs).
- Since fully operating, the CTN has steadily grown to **1014 network members**.

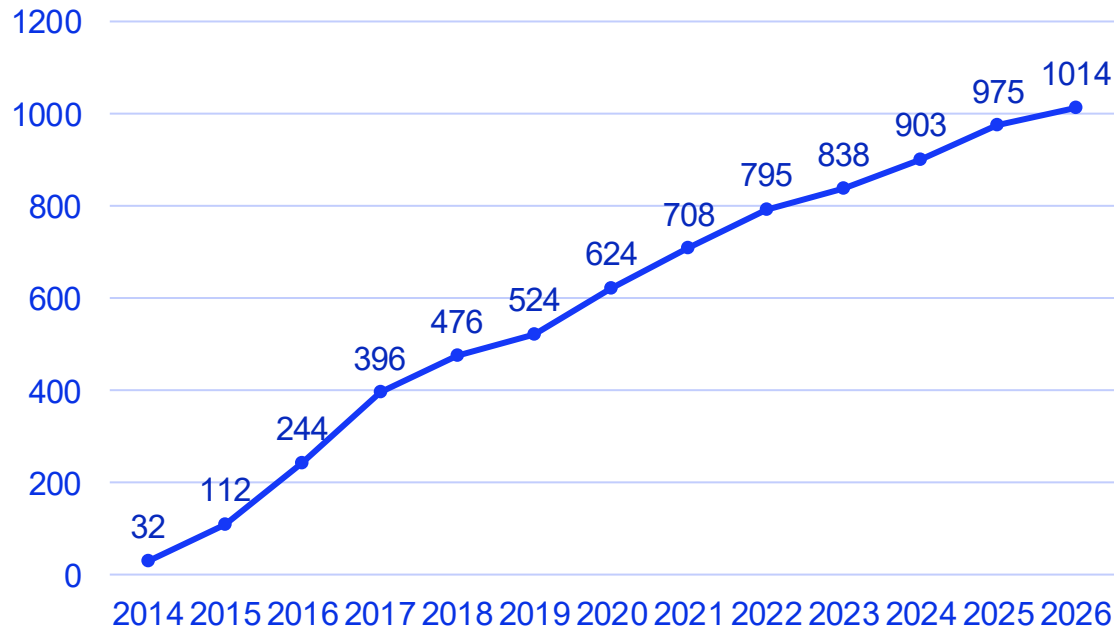

Supporting the CTCN in facilitating **technology transfer for developing countries**

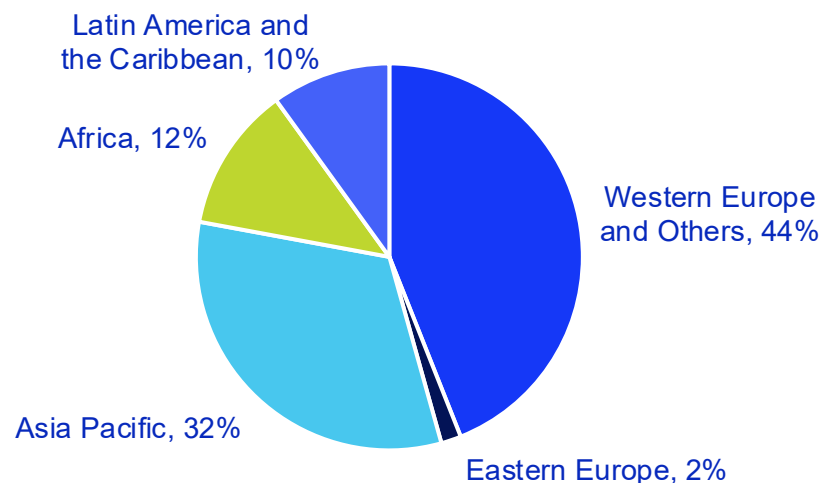

Regional Distribution of Network Members



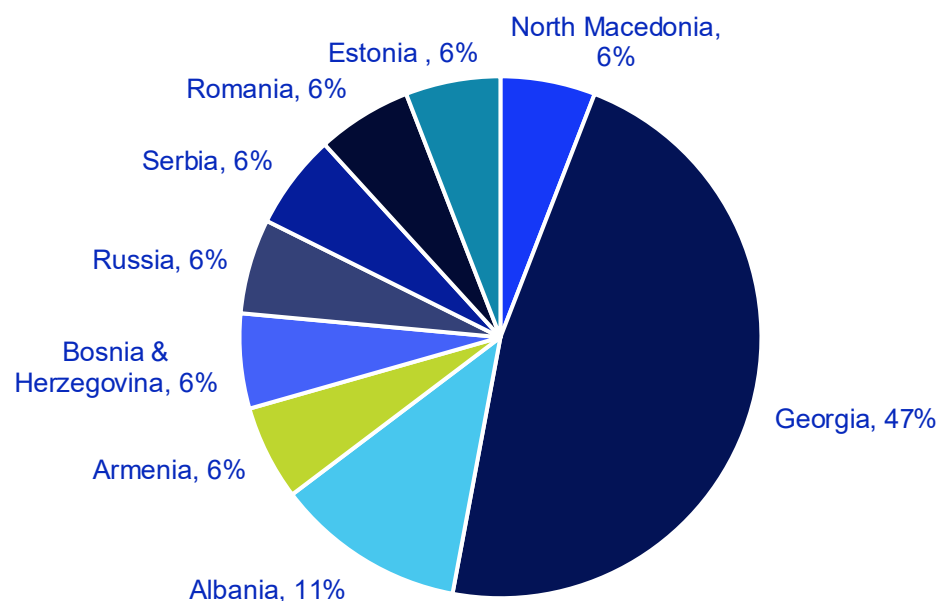

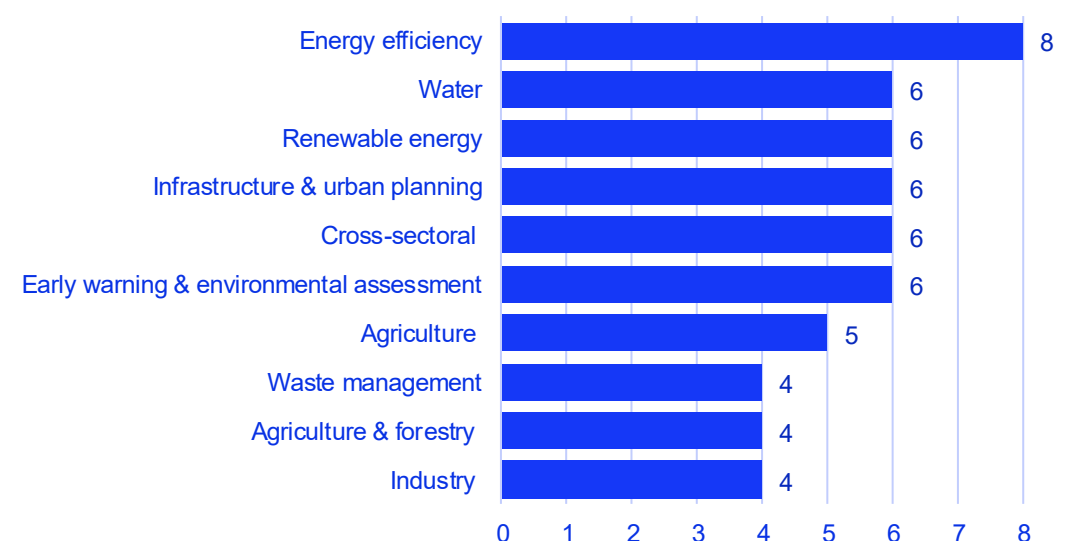
Network Members from Eastern Europe

17 Network Members across 9 countries, with almost half based in Georgia. NGOs and private-sector organisations make up the majority of members.

Members bring strong **cross-sectoral expertise**, particularly in energy efficiency, renewable energy, water, infrastructure and environmental assessment.



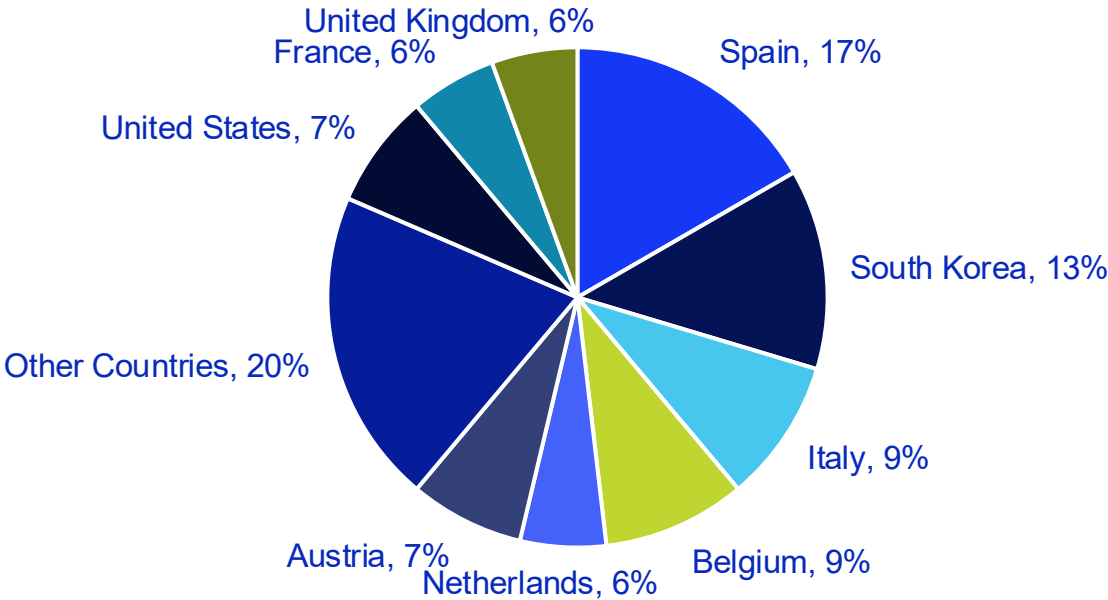

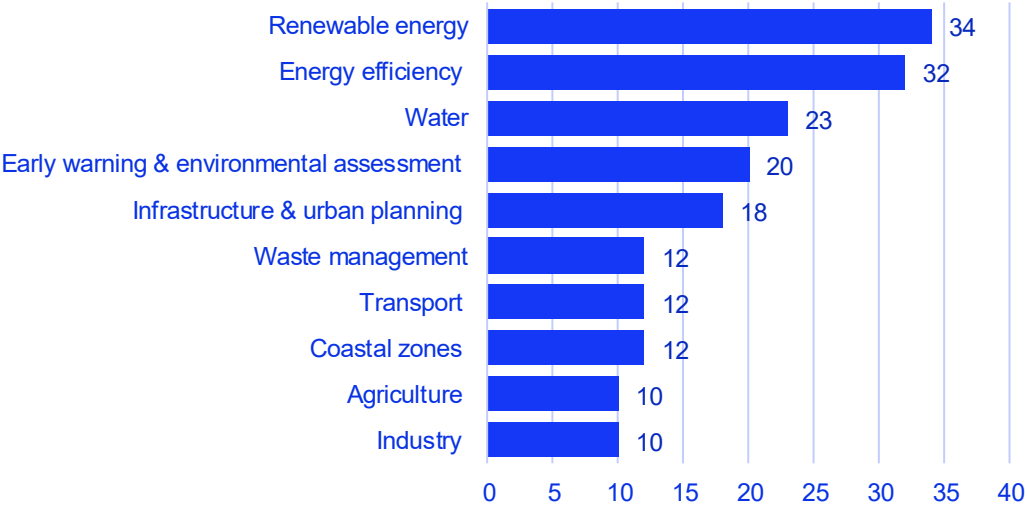
Network Members Active in Eastern Europe

54 Network Members outside of Eastern Europe, registered across 18 countries, indicated to be active in the region. They are based predominantly in Western Europe and Others (45 members / 83%), with a further 9 members from Asia-Pacific.

The **majority are private-sector organisations**, complemented by strong research and academic representation, with particularly extensive expertise in **renewable energy, energy efficiency, water**, environmental assessment, and infrastructure and urban planning.

The Adoption of Network Engagement Strategy

Strategic Action 1: Facilitating collaboration and finance linkages through new engagement modalities

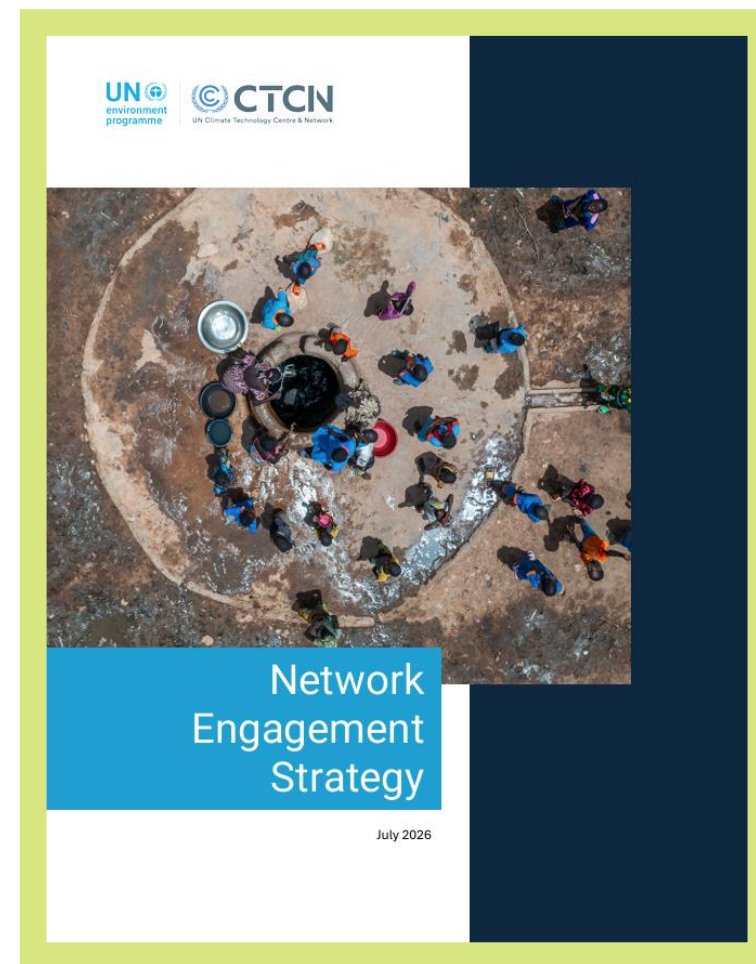

How to Engage as Network Member

Bidding for Technical Assistance Projects

Participate in bids to implement projects in developing countries

Members can participate in bidding process to implement CTCN technical assistance projects in developing countries, applying their expertise to deliver practical, on-the-ground solutions.

Network Members can view [Technical Assistance opportunities](#) open for Network Members' bidding on our website. They are all also posted on the UNGM Portal and shared via email once posted.

Virtual Events and Matchmaking Opportunities

Thematic Webinars

Network members can participate in or co-host thematic webinars to showcase expertise, exchange knowledge, and connect with a global audience of practitioners and stakeholders.

Network Fairs at Regional NDE Forum

Members can join in person to engage directly with National Designated Entities (NDEs), present their services, and explore collaboration opportunities in a focused regional setting.

Other engagements

Additional opportunities, including Voluntary Technology Talk, Co-creating Climate Solutions and potential events held alongside major international gatherings such as UNFCCC COP.

Knowledge Sharing and Capacity Building Activities

Publications and Knowledge Products

Members can collaborate with CTCN on joint publications and knowledge products that highlight practical experience, lessons learned, and innovative approaches.

Showcasing Solutions

Members can present their technologies and tools on the CTCN website to increase visibility and connect with potential partners.

Capacity Building Programme

Members can contribute as speakers or facilitators in regional capacity-building programmes, sharing expertise and supporting institutional and technical strengthening.

How to Become a Network Member

Who can join?

Organizations from the private and public sectors, NGOs, research and academia, financial institutions, technology centres, and international or regional organizations with relevant climate technology expertise. Membership is free of charge.

Membership eligibility criteria

1. Institutional set-up

Be a legally registered organization or a recognized partnership, initiative, network or association.

2. Technical capacity

Demonstrate relevant experience, mandate or potential to support the development, transfer and deployment of climate technologies in developing countries.

3. Operational & organizational stability

Demonstrate sufficient financial, human and organizational capacity to deliver relevant climate technology services and activities.

4. Ethical conduct

Pledge to comply with the CTCN Code of Conduct.

How to apply

1. Create an account

Register for a Network Member account on the [CTCN website](#).

2. Complete your application

Provide information on your organization, expertise and experience, and upload the required documentation (in English).

3. Submit for assessment (approx. 6 weeks)

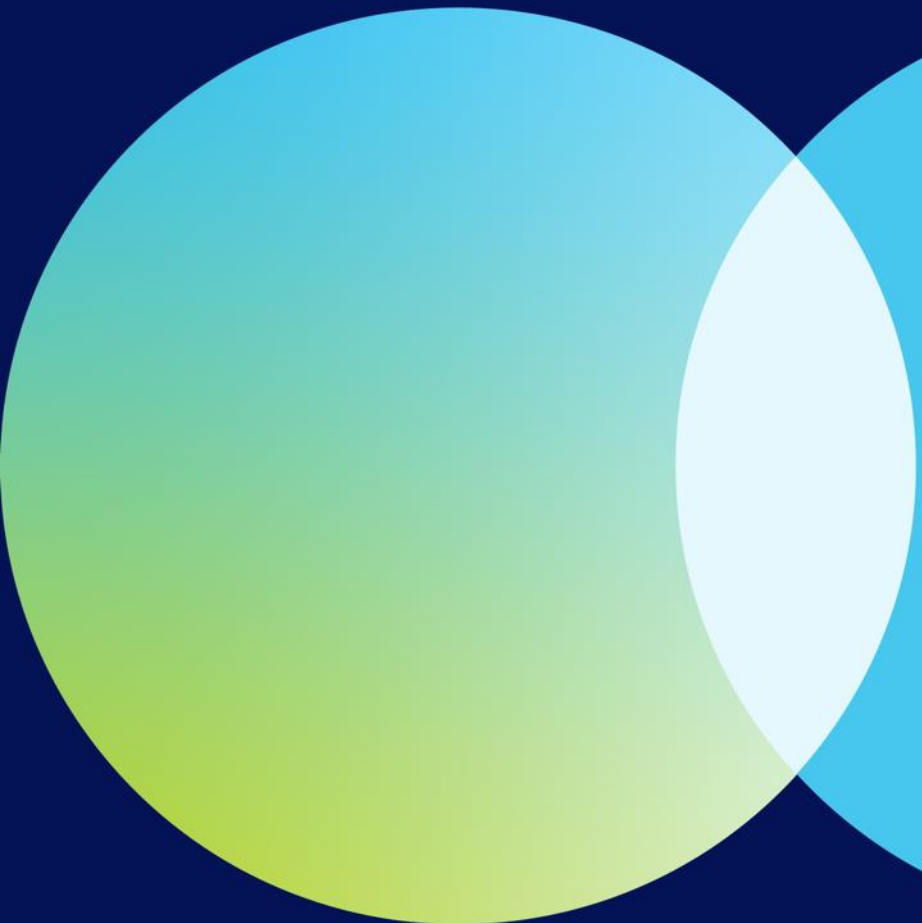
CTCN reviews the application and may request additional information.

4. Membership approved

Following assessment and approval, the organization becomes a CTC Network Member.
