- **Network members a part of the CTCN stakeholder group:** Network members, NDEs, Consortium partners, Strategic partners, Knowledge partners

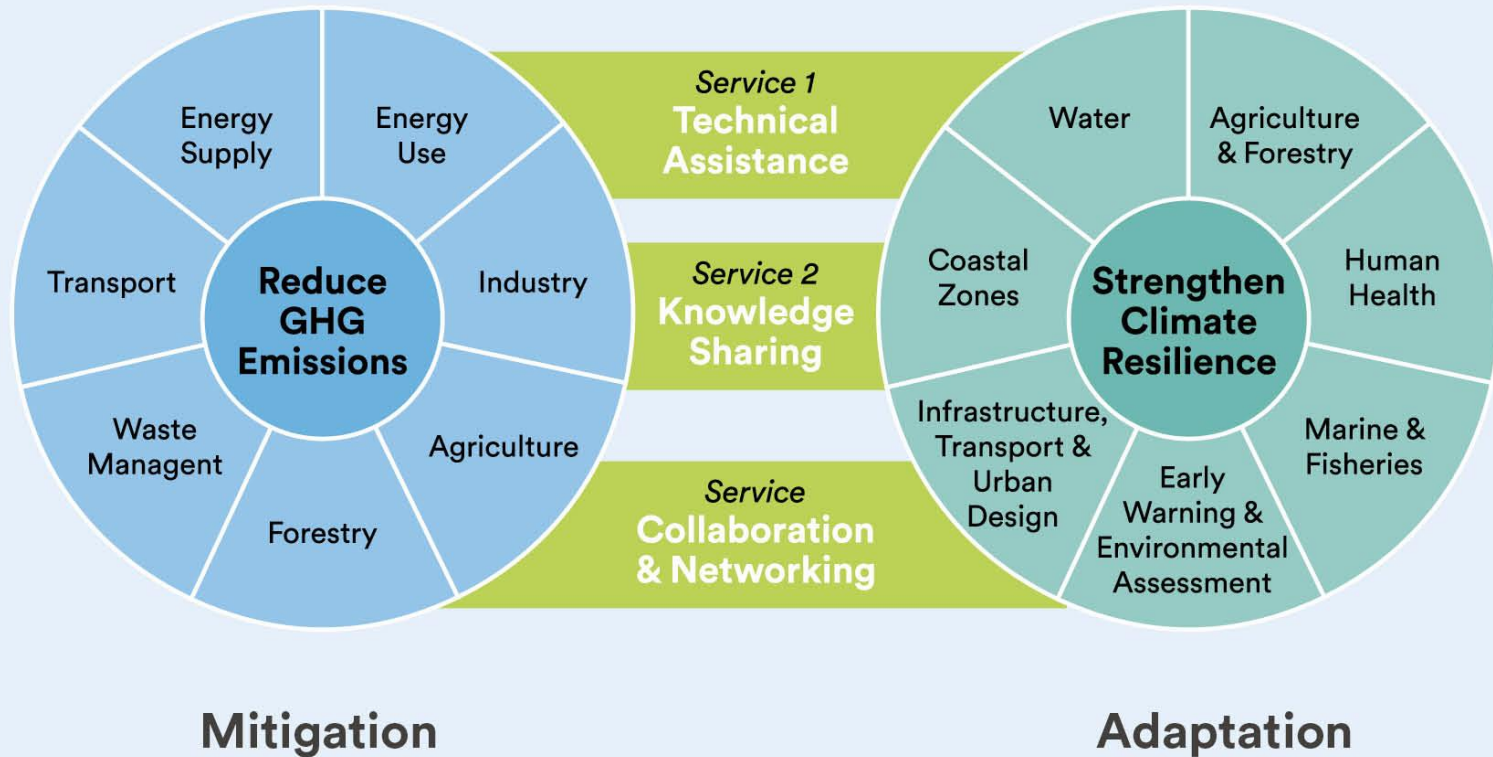


The Climate Technology Network

Strong Network of 170 + institutions



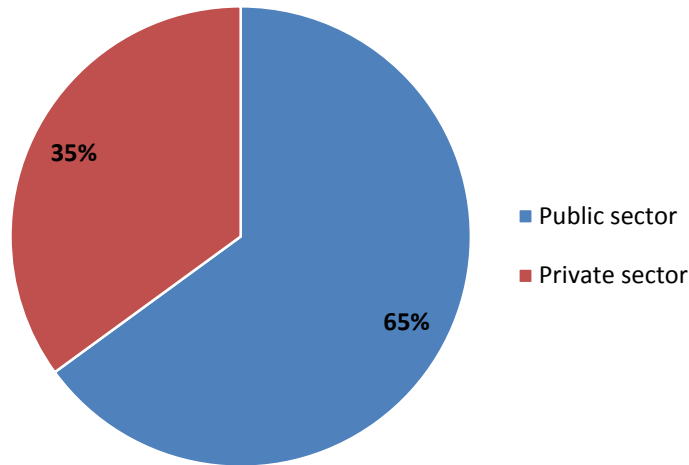
CTCN service areas and core sectors



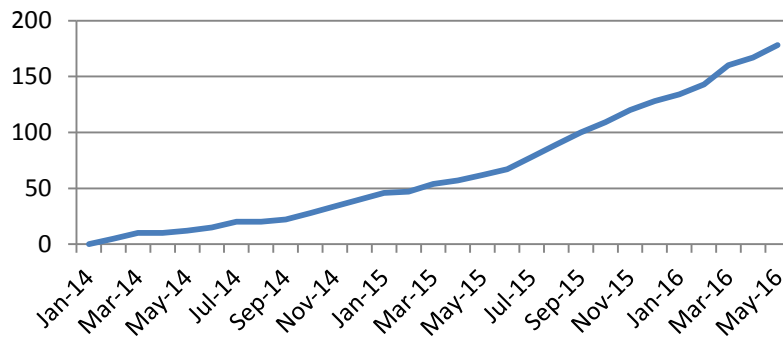
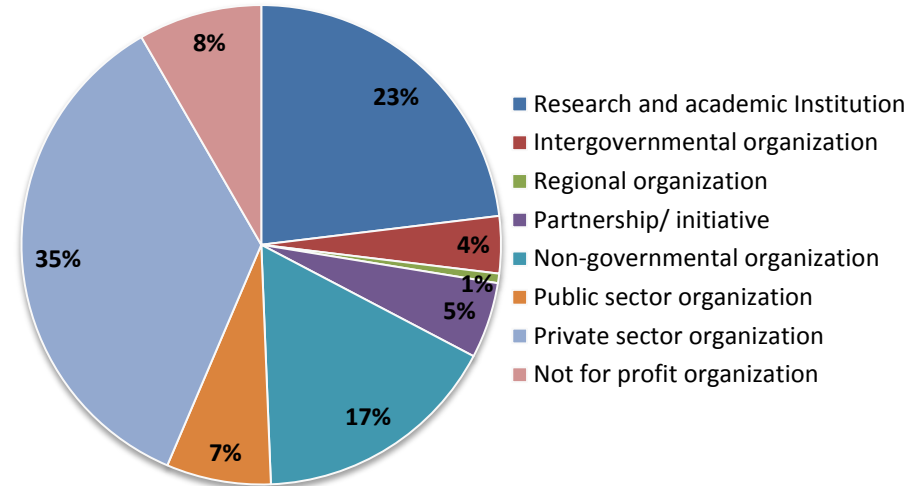
The status of the CTC Network

- **Distribution:** 53 % from Annex 1 countries, 40 % Non-Annex 1 countries, 7 % International

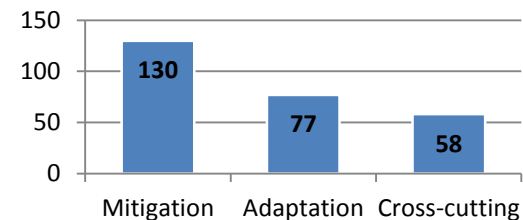
Public vs. Private sector
