- TEC has undertaken intersessional activities in various thematic areas of the technology framework
- At TEC 19 (16-19 September 2019), TEC plans to finalise its workplan for 2019-2022
- TEC workplan activities, include those related to:
 - COP/CMA mandates from Katowice
 - Five thematic areas of the technology framework
- For many of its activities the TEC will continue to collaborate closely with the CTCN

TEC intersessional activities in 2019

Collaboration and stakeholder engagement

- TEC in collaboration with WIM Excom organized an Expert Dialogue on technologies for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage in coastal zones at SB 50.
- TEC organized two regional Technical Expert Meetings in collaboration with CTCN during the Climate Weeks.
- TEC members participated in NDE Forums organised by CTCN.
- TEC organised a side event on the implementation of the technology framework in collaboration with CTCN at SB 50.

Support

- TEC updated the evaluation report of the GEF Poznan strategic programme on technology transfer for consideration at SBI 50 (June 2019).
- TEC collaborated with CTCN in developing a Monitoring and Evaluation system to report on the activities of the TEC.



19th TEC meeting (16-19 September 2019)

Highlights

- Agree on TEC workplan for 2019-2022, incorporating guidance contained in the Technology Framework adopted in Katowice.
- Agree on joint activities of TEC and CTCN.
- Agree on the report on activities and performance of the TEC for 2019, including key messages and recommendations to COP/CMA and the joint chapter of the joint annual report of the TEC and the CTCN for 2019.




TEC 19: key activities by thematic area

Implementation

- Paper on experiences, lessons learned and good practices in conducting Technology Needs Assessments and implementing their results.
- Recommendations to Parties on ways forward and actions to be taken based on the outcomes of the Technical Expert Meetings on mitigation.
- Analysis of policy and technology options for encouraging behavioural changes.

Enabling environments and capacity building

- Development and enhancement of endogenous capacities and technologies (feedback from other constituted bodies on previous TEC findings and potential collaboration with PCCB).
- Relationship between gender and technology.



TEC 19: key activities by thematic area

Collaboration and stakeholder engagement

- Joint work with WIM Excom on developing a joint policy brief on technologies for averting, minimising, and addressing loss and damage in coastal zones.
- Input to the Adaptation Committee on technology issues relevant to Technical Expert Meetings on adaptation.

Support

- Collaboration with GCF on support for climate technologies.
- Follow-up key messages and relevant recommendations of the updated evaluation report of the Poznan strategic programme.
- Inputs to the Standing Committee on Finance on draft guidance for the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism



Conclusion

- The TEC undertook intersessional activities, including through close collaboration with the CTCN
- We look forward to continuing to work together to:
 - a) respond to COP/CMA guidance and support the implementation of the Paris Agreement
 - b) support the implementation of technology elements of NDCs and NAPs
 - c) enhance collaboration with Parties and other relevant stakeholders
